Dr. William Weinert Clinician and Adjudicator

William Weinert is now in his eleventh year as Professor of Conducting and Director of Choral Activities at the Eastman School of Music, where he conducts the Eastman Chorale and the Eastman-Rochester Chorus and supervises students in the masters and doctoral programs in choral conducting. Weinert has previously taught at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and the University of Southern Mississippi, and has served for three summers as guest professor at the Staatliche Hochschule für Musik in Freiburg, Germany. He has conducted throughout Europe and the United States, as well as in Hong Kong. He holds degrees from Oberlin College and Conservatory of Music where he studied with Daniel Moe, and the doctorate in conducting from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, where he studied with Robert Fountain.

Ensembles under Weinert's direction have performed at conferences of the American Choral Directors' Association and the Music Educators' National Conference. He has served throughout the country as a clinician and an adjudicator, as well as giving master classes in conducting in North America, Europe and Asia.

Weinert has frequently conducted opera and symphonic repertoire, and has performed extensively as a recitalist, oratorio soloist, and clarinetist. He has published research on the music of Brahms and Bruckner and Georg Schumann, as well as an edition of motets by the prominent baroque composer Melchior Franck. In 1998 he succeeded Alfred Mann as editor of *The American Choral Review*, the journal of the American Choral Foundation.
